



Work-Study



You are eligible if...

- You have at least \$3,000 of unmet need-based eligibility
- You must indicate interest in Work-Study on the FAFSA or WASFA
- You maintain satisfactory academic progress

Award Amounts

- The total amount varies based on need
- Awards can range from \$1,000 to \$7,000 for a full academic year
- Maximum award: \$3,000 per semester

Work-Study Step-by-Step



Submit FAFSA or WASFA & Verification Documents

Once eligibility is determined, you will receive a checklist & notice in myWSU

Find a Work-Study job

Your employer will submit a Work-Study Authorization form

You & your employer will receive notice of your award amount

Things to Note

- Handshake and the ASCC are great resources when looking for a Work-Study job.
- If you work prior to receiving a Work-Study award, it is possible the employer will be responsible for paying your wages entirely.
- Your award is a placeholder on your financial aid account, meaning you can earn up to that value each term.
- Once Work-Study funding is exhausted, you and your employer will be notified that no further awarding will take place.
